Transportation and Accessibility

International Access

Many of the major international and regional airlines fly into Harare, Bulawayo and Victoria Falls Airports. South African Airways, BA Comair, Air Zimbabwe and Air Namibia all fly into Victoria Falls Airport. Emirates, Ethiopian Airlines, South African Airways, Kenyan Airways, Air Namibia and BA Comair fly into Harare Airport. South African Airways and Air Zimbabwe fly into Bulawayo Airport.

Airport Meet and Greet

In Victoria Falls, Harare and Bulawayo you will be met by our local representatives who will assist you with your luggage and take you to your next destination.

Airport Transfers

If you require an overnight stay in Harare or Bulawayo, either at the beginning or the end of your holiday, we will book transfers with our representatives and their team will see you safely to and from your hotel.

Getting Around Zimbabwe

The road system in Zimbabwe is still good and many parts of the country can easily be accessed by road – either self drive or organized road transfers with a driver. Some parts of the country will require 4x4 vehicles especially if you are venturing further into the parks. Zimbabwe is a safe and friendly destination but driving at night should be avoided due to animals on roads and vehicles driving with poor or no lighting. Vehicles can be hired in Harare, Victoria Falls or Bulawayo from a number of different car hire companies. Vehicles are driven on the left hand side of the road. A valid international driver's license, along with vehicle registration documents, are required to drive in Zimbabwe, and drivers should always carry them.

Many of the charter companies offer seat rates between the different parks and areas of Zimbabwe making it easy and affordable to get around by air. Air Zimbabwe offers commercial flights between Harare, Bulawayo, Victoria Falls and Kariba.

There are reliable bus services between the major cities offered by Pathfinder. Services are generally reliable and safe.
